

The Observatory for Dual Career, Disability and Sport STATUTES

Article 1. Description

The Observatory on Dual Career, Disability and Sport is a collegial body for the evaluation, analysis and monitoring of the impact of the project and the possibility of carrying out future actions that contribute to the work of promoting social integration and inclusive sport.

Article 2. Objectives

The objectives of the Observatory on Dual Career, Disability and Sport are the evaluation, analysis and regular dissemination of information on social integration and adapted sport through higher education. Its task will be to draw up periodic reports and proposals for action and improvement, which may also serve as an advisory resource if necessary.

Article 3. Location

The Observatory will be physically located at the EAS headquarters and will initially be formed by the participating institutions of the Consortium.

Article 4. Participants

The Governing Board shall be composed of at least one representative of each of the institutions participating in the Consortium (UCAM, EAS, ONCE and EPC). Representatives of the European Commission shall be invited to participate in the organisation chart of the Observatory.

Article 5. Functions

The functions of the Observatory shall include the following

- Cooperation and promotion of cooperation between institutions involved in social inclusion and adapted sport.
- To act as a body for collecting, analysing and disseminating information on the subject of the project.





- Make recommendations and proposals to improve indicators related to dual career, disability and sport.
- Collect information on measures taken by public and private institutions.
- Evaluate the impact and actions taken to promote adapted sport and inclusion.
- To produce reports and studies on the subject in order to provide the most accurate diagnosis of this social phenomenon.
- To advise public administrations and other stakeholders on the dual career of disabled student-athletes.
- To create forums for the exchange of ideas in order to promote communication between stakeholders and athletes with disabilities.
- To propose, where necessary, specific measures to prevent, penalise and eradicate the social exclusion of disabled sportspersons and to monitor these proposals.
- · To maintain relations with similar national and international institutions.
- To report the activities and findings of the Observatory to the National and International Paralympic Committees.

Article 6. Meetings

The Observatory shall meet regularly, at least once a year, in conjunction with the annual meetings of the EAS.
